Message from Maria



Dear All,

Welcome to your Autumn/Winter 2022 edition of *Cwtch*. I hope you and yours had an enjoyable summer.

Just months after celebrating her Platinum Jubilee, we were saddened by the loss of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. On behalf of the entire Tŷ Hafan family, I sent a note of our deepest condolences to His Majesty King Charles III, our loyal patron since 2001, on the death of his beloved mother. Our thoughts and prayers remain with His Majesty, The Queen Consort and members of the wider Royal Family.

Grief and loss, love and living are the themes of *Rose's story* which is at the heart of our upcoming fundraising campaign.

Parents Andrew and Catherine Jeans talk about the incredible support Tŷ Hafan gave them, their son Oliver [and their extended family] when Rose, their beautiful baby daughter, was diagnosed with inoperable cancer – which so cruelly claimed her life just two days after her first birthday.

Catherine told us: “We are the unlucky, lucky ones. How do you make that decision where to take your child to die? ... In hospital it's noisy, it's chaotic and very clinical. Tŷ Hafan is a home-from-home environment. Everyone matters.

“If Tŷ Hafan wasn't there for us, I don't know what we would have done.”

On page 4, you will find information on different ways you can support us to keep on providing end-of-life care for children like Rose and her grieving family, helping them to create precious memories and to live again after the loss of their beloved child. As Her Majesty famously said during the pandemic: **“Grief is the price we pay for love.”**

Finally, you may have seen media coverage about how the cost-of-living crisis is impacting our charity, in particular, with huge rises in our energy bills. No doubt this awful crisis is impacting you, too. We hope you can stay positive.

As always, we remain resolute in our commitment to be there for the children and families who need us, and we cannot do this without you. Thank you for your unwavering support.

Rising costs

With the huge impact of the cost-of-living crisis on all areas of our work, we need your help more than ever. You might have seen on the news that our energy bills were set to go from £100,000 to £600,000 per year. Now, set to be around £400,000 per year (for the next six months), we are in an even more financially challenging situation than we faced during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Demand for our services is increasing, but we're losing donations because many people simply can't afford to give to us right now. Tŷ Hafan's donations from individuals have dropped by 50% compared to last year.

Plus, with energy prices dramatically increasing, the essential specialist equipment that we use in the hospice is becoming more and more expensive to run.

We worked hard to share how the cost of living crisis is affecting us in the media, including TV, radio and online coverage from BBC Wales, a live broadcast from the hospice with Good Morning Britain, The Jeremy Vine Show on BBC Radio 2 and we were even mentioned on Newsnight.

We've had lots more radio coverage, too and we were also on Newyddion and BBC Cymru Fyw. Here's a big thank you to Alex and Felix, Jayde and Savannah-Bleu and Bridget and Elain for supporting us in our media outreach.

Of course, we're very grateful to be able to share our story in this way. We're so grateful for the generosity of our supporters which is crucial in helping us to make it through this national crisis.

This year we had a face-to-face service and a virtual one!

The Den

The Den is now fully furnished! *The Den* is an epic area for the young people who visit Tŷ Hafan. It's a better suited space for their needs than the child-focused hospice environment we have for younger children.

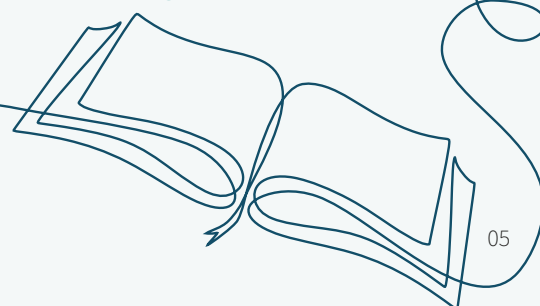
Seth Burke meeting King Charles III

We're so proud of Seth Burke who met King Charles and the Queen Consort at the Senedd as part of his role as Welsh Youth Parliament Member. Seth has been using Tŷ Hafan's services for over 5 years. He is the first wheelchair user in the Senedd's adult or youth parliaments and is the first Member with Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy.

Seth described this fantastic experience: "The King had to bend down to talk to me because I'm in a wheelchair. This I found really funny, as in all the photos he looks like he's bowing to me! He shook my hand and asked me if I was still in school.

"Next, I met the Queen Consort and she was really nice, too. She asked if I was bunking off school and said she "wouldn't tell" if I was. I said, "Thank you - there are billions of cameras looking at us though," and she laughed about that."

Well done for making history, Seth!



End-of-life care in a home-from-home



Perhaps from an early age, we feel unable to talk about dying. For some, this might have even been discouraged. But as sensitive as it is, *we must talk about this*. Between April and September this year, 14 children have died at Tŷ Hafan. In that time, and throughout all the years we've been there for families, we have worked tirelessly to make the most out of every moment of a child's life. It's our purpose.

When the time comes for a child to die, we're with our families every step of the way, providing emotional and practical help whenever and however it's needed.

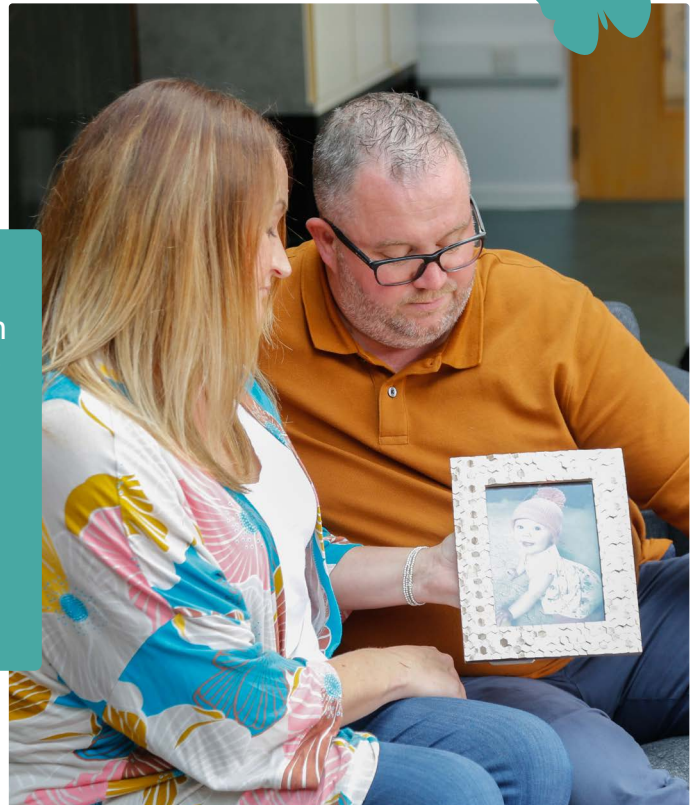
There are many myths surrounding what end-of-life and bereavement care is like. In truth, *every experience is unique*.

End-of-life care at Tŷ Hafan

End-of-life care at Tŷ Hafan starts when we meet the family for the first time. While families might worry about their child dying at home, most of the families we work with choose not to see their child die in hospital. Being at Tŷ Hafan offers them balance – a home-from-home – with expertise from palliative care professionals.

Specialists and Family Support Practitioners meet with the family to get to know their wishes inside out. Working with healthcare professionals in the NHS, we put together and deliver individual care plans.

Family Support Practitioners give families quality psychological and emotional care to help them cope with the complex and consuming feelings that death and bereavement can bring.

When the time of passing comes to a child, we're here, making the process as comfortable and comforting as possible with medical support like pain management and compassionate removal of breathing support (known as extubation). Families can have as much or as little privacy and emotional support they need during this difficult time.

Accommodation, facilities and specialist equipment are all available at our hospice so that a family – and extended family – can stay with their child before and after they've died.

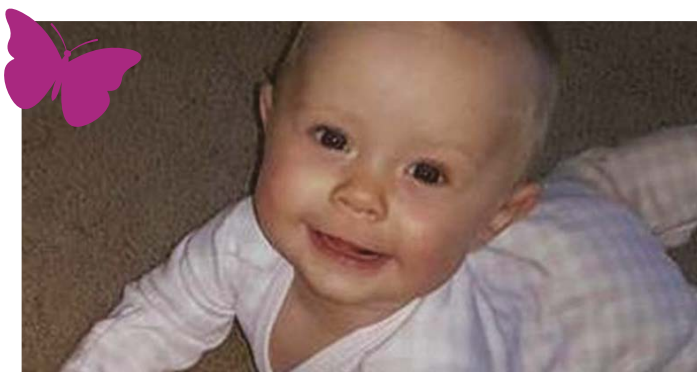
We offer practical help to take some of the pressure from the family's shoulders. We can register their child's death, help with informing other relatives and friends of their passing and assist with funeral arrangements.

Tŷ Hafan's support doesn't end when a child dies

Our relationship with families continues after a child has died. We offer access to support groups that can be used whenever they are needed, and for however long they are needed. Access to the hospice gardens and our memorial space is also available for quiet contemplation and reflection. We are always here for a cuppa and a chat. Always.

Rose Jeans

Rose's story

The Jeans family have experienced end-of-life care at Tŷ Hafan.

Andrew and Catherine Jeans' baby daughter, Rose, died of Atypical Teratoid Rhabdoid Tumour (ATRT) just days after her first birthday.

"If Tŷ Hafan wasn't there for us, I just don't know what we would have done. Tŷ Hafan gave us privacy. But we could still have family around us. Tŷ Hafan enabled them all to be there for us. It's a home from home environment. Everyone matters. In hospital it's different, it's noisy, it's chaotic and very clinical," Catherine tells us.

"What does Tŷ Hafan give you? Moments you can share. Camaraderie. Relationships in most difficult times. We are the unlucky lucky ones. How do you make that decision where to take your child to die?"

"For us, we did not want to go home for Rose to die at home because you've got to live in that house afterwards."

"What Tŷ Hafan gives you is priceless. We would not have provided what Tŷ Hafan did for our daughter. The care and love Tŷ Hafan showed was amazing. We could come

Did you know...?

Memory making is a big part of end-of-life care at Tŷ Hafan. It can include all kinds of activities, like exciting experiences, decorating the child's room with their favourite things, taking photographs, making handprints and hand casts and creating artwork together.

Did you know...?

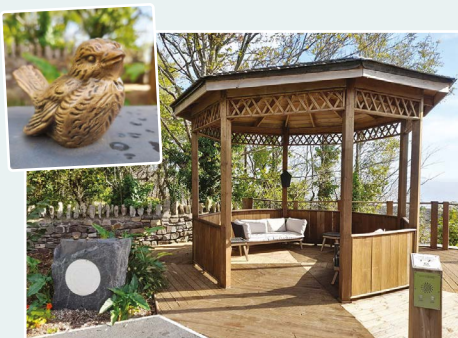
Did you know we have seven therapeutic support groups, such as our Super Sibs club?

These groups give families space to talk to others who understand their situation.

Did you know...?

Did you know that we remember children with our Birdsong Project?

When a child dies at Tŷ Hafan, their name is translated into birdsong (the song of the bird that sings the loudest during the month they were born). The birdsong is followed by a second of silence for each year of their life.

together for Rose's first birthday. Oliver [Andrew and Catherine's son] was entertained which meant that we could focus on Rose.

"Oliver will be 10 in December and he has had to go through so much in his life already. But thanks to Tŷ Hafan, he's coming on amazing! He's had counselling to help him cope with the death of his baby sister and everything we've had to go through."

"He's also a member of Tŷ Hafan's Super Sibs group and he loves that because he's with other children who are going through similar things. He doesn't have to say anything, if he doesn't want to. They just know. And it's the same for us. We're in every group. We know that you are there if we ever need anything."

A day in the life of... a hospice nurse

It goes without saying that we couldn't give families the standard of care that we do without our brilliant team at Tŷ Hafan Children's Hospice. But what does a day in their life actually look like? It might be different to how you imagine it. We spoke to one of our outstanding team members, Carly Davies, who is a Learning Disability Nurse (RNLD), to find out.



Carly Davies - Learning Disability Nurse

"First thing in the morning, we do a handover. This is where the night staff tell us how the children at the hospice have been overnight. My usual shift pattern involves three 12-hour shifts every week, but I sometimes cover night shifts, as well.

"When we start our shift, we're told which child and family we're going to be looking after that day - the care and support we provide hugely varies from child to child, depending on their needs.

"For me, it's not just about meeting the child's clinical needs, although that's the priority. It's about making their stay here as enjoyable as possible. It's often a mixture of accessing the Play Team and the services they offer and using my own initiative to engage the child in their favourite activities.

"That could be all kinds of different things. The excellent Play Team organise a wide range of activities like crafts, walks, day trips and even story massage. Story massage is an activity that I often support the Play Team with. It's where they read stories to the children, but the story has a massage incorporated into it, and I do the massage.

"I come from a theatre background, so I try to incorporate that as much as possible by singing with the children... but sometimes they tell me to stop! I think when people think of hospice care, they think of it as being really sad. And it can be. But there are lots of aspects of Tŷ Hafan that are so uplifting.

"For example, before I started, I didn't know there was a Play Team. It offers families that little bit more.

Something I think is amazing is the equipment in the music room that enables children who struggle with movement to use their eyes to make music! So, even children with very limited mobility can still be involved in exciting activities.

"Of course, there are challenges that come with working in a children's hospice. It can be a hard job and it can be emotionally exhausting, but it's really rewarding. For a family to allow you to be a part of their journey, for me, is a great honour. It's really special.

"By far the best part of my job is getting to know the children and building a rapport with them and their families. There's nothing better than engaging a child in an activity they love and they're smiling and they're happy."

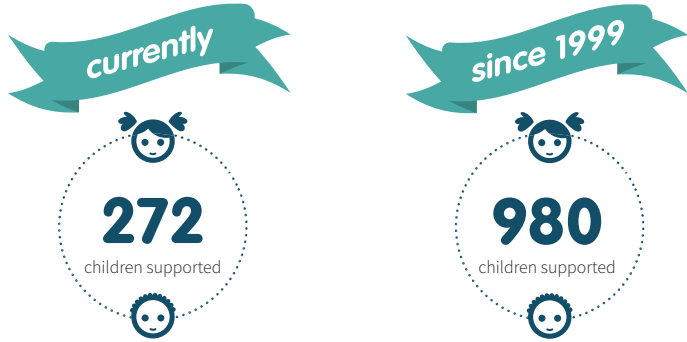

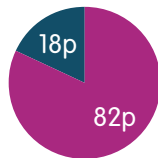

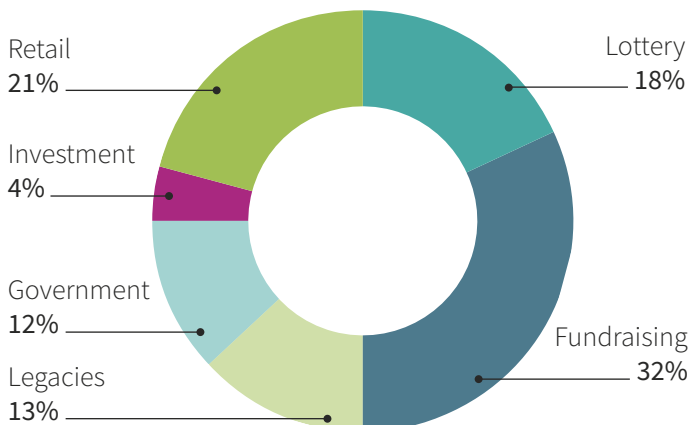
